Programs Available

Assoc. of Arts in Teaching (AAT) for Early Childhood Grades (Pre K-4)

Statewide transfer program for non-degree (0 – 60 college credit hours) students interested in teaching children in Elementary Grades. Students will complete one half of the requirements for a bachelor's degree before transferring to the university to complete a bachelor's degree and teacher certification.

Assoc. of Arts in Teaching (AAT) for All Grades (Pre K-12)

Statewide transfer program for non-degree (0 – 60 college credit hours) students who are unsure what grades to teach. Students will complete one half of the requirements for a bachelor's degree before transferring to the university to complete teacher certification.

Assoc. of App. Sciences for Bilingual Ed. Teacher Assistants

This program is designed for non-degree students who are interested teaching in classrooms where two languages are spoken (English and Spanish or English and Vietnamese). Graduates of this program will also be eligible for the Excellence in Teaching Partnership between Richland College and Texas Woman's University for teacher certification.

Assoc. of App. Sciences for English as a Second Language (ESL) Teacher Assistants

This program is designed for non-degree students who are interested teaching in classrooms where students of different languages are taught English. Graduates of this program will also be eligible for the Excellence in Teaching Partnership between Richland College and Texas Woman's University for teacher certification.

Alternative Certification for Teachers (minimum bachelor's degree required)

This is a one year accelerated State Board of Educator Certification Program designed for degreed career changers wanting to teach in critical need areas such as Bilingual, ESL, Special Education, and Math.

Prof. Development for Teachers & Teacher Assistants

This is a program designed to assist educators in meeting No Child Left Behind requirements. The primary focus is on effective use of Educational Game Technology and Multi-media instruction.
